The Parenting PATH in Stokes County

Services Offered in Stokes

Parent Support

Home-based intervention for families. Treatment may last up to 3 months with case management. Program available in Forsyth, Stokes and Surry counties.

Parent/Teen Solutions

5-month program, 3 hours per week In home visitation services (7-17 years). Participants learn about healthy communication, relationships, and topics relevant to teens.

Intensive Family Preservation Services (IFPS)

28-day program, 10 hours per week.
Intensive home visitation for families to prevent out of home placement of children. Services include: family assessment, intensive family and individual attention, client advocacy, case-management, enhancement of parenting skills, and referral to other services as appropriate. Offered in Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Iredell, Rockingham, Rowan, Stokes, Surry and Yadkin counties.

Supervised Visitation and Monitored Exchange

Supervised visits and exchanges are designed to assure that children can have safe contact or transfer with a non-custodial parent without conflict. Parents may be in the midst of divorce, or impacted by 50B protection plans.

The Case for Support

The Parenting PATH (formerly Stokes SCAN) provides a variety of programs to prevent and treat child abuse and neglect.

Children **aged 0-3** living in Stokes County are **52%** more likely to be abused than other children in North Carolina.*

Children **aged 4-5** living in Stokes County are **151%** more likely to be abused than other children in North Carolina.*

The Parenting PATH is raising funds to provide additional services to families in Stokes County. All funds raised will go to serving local families.

These funds will assist us in creating an additional position that will serve 30 families each year, working with them in home, providing family support and counseling, teaching parenting skills and keeping Stokes County children safe.

The Parenting PATH works with Stokes County Health Department and Stokes Department of Social Services to identify and serve local families.
